Burlingame, Calif., (July 29, 2022) – Today, the Peninsula Health Care District announces that Director Helen Galligan will not be seeking re-election. Her term ends December 2022.

Having been first appointed to the Board in 2006 and then elected four times, Director Galligan's leadership can be felt throughout the region. From chairing the Board's Community Health Investment Committee, planning the building of the Trousdale, to helping make Sonrisas Dental Health Center an asset for San Mateo County, Galligan brought the attributes she applied in her career as a registered nurse to the boardroom by leading with an emphasis on compassion.

Candidates interested in running for the board seat have until August 12, 2022 to submit their paperwork to the San Mateo Registrar of Voters to get their name on the November 2022 ballot.
